And as of now, multiple people including myself have not received a stipend since the month of June. So, I've been trying to find out what's going on. Our liaison sent an e mail last month in September requesting what's about the CAF for July and August. And I was included in the e mail, and they replied that we have we have the forms. But the reimbursements will go out soon. So that was last month for July and August. And here is another month. And they have not sent out anything. And we had several months ago, three months ago you had Dr. Wong I believe it was. She had a presentation. And she mentioned</p>

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				<p>what a record-breaking attendance that people had signed up. But she never mentioned the people that were already signed up that wasn't receiving their stipends.</p> <p>And so, as a consumer, I think it's adding to the stress and anxiety that some of us are already dealing with. You know?</p> <p>You made a promise that within 30 days that we would be reimbursed for participating.</p> <p>And right now, it's over 120 days.</p> <p>And even our liaisons can't they're not even being told the truth.</p>

So, I've been in my apartment for three months and I'm not getting any words on anything about what's going on. Each time I ask or inquire about it, I'm always told we put your order in. But that's the only thing I hear.</p> <p>So, I'd like to know more about what's going on with that myself.</p>

Where I got started in the city and the center has been open since it was in the corner on 6th. But long story short I've been dealing with it for four years now and plus the resource centers that are down there, it's helping. Helped me get on my feet. I've got my own place. Got off the street. Stuff like that. So, you see me down there almost every day. The peer center. And for the clubhouse, get started with the clubhouse. And in the meantime, representing the peer center and the clubhouse.</p>

He is actively engaging in outreach and engagement in the soup kitchen on Wilshire and Saint James on Fridays and Saturdays and passing out flyers and information about activities at the Peer Resource Center. It's really good and he's doing some great work. This is briefly just want to talk about the CAF. I know some people that are interested in the CAF, but the orientation is not readily available either. Once a week or once a month. My question is instead of having a liaison from the department come down, why doesn't the department train our mental health community health workers to know how to give the orientation to sign them up for the forms, the county, the county vendor forms. Do all that paperwork and then be part of the process. They are peers and they see us most often. Many of us are</p>

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				coming in and this is first point of contact. And if they have that training, if the department would give them that training, I'm pretty sure a lot more people would be signed up. Thank you so much.

I'm a CAF participant and fortunate to walk in into the Peer Resource Center and I was welcomed with open arms by Mrs. Clay sitting here right now. She was wonderful. Thanks to her I was able to participate. However, and this is not what's the word I'm looking for? Let me explain what happened. So, I am older, not good with technology and I was not able to attend the online meeting. The orientation for the CAF program. Because of that I was excluded from the program.</p> <p>So, I insisted and insisted and insisted and contacted every possible person, including Dr. Wong.</p> <p>And finally, I did get a response back from the person in charge of district four. And she said my apologies. You're in. Start attending the meetings. And we'll take care of that, and you can attend an orientation in December.</p> <p>So, he's right. The orientations are the one I was supposed to attend was in July. The next one is not until December. So, we have a lot of people interested. And Dr. Wong herself spoke about she wants the community to participate and that program is open and available, readily available. But the orientations are not, and I don't give up. I insisted and spoke and wrote e mails and I was actually a little reprimanded writing to Dr. Wong because I was told</p>

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				<p>there's a chain in command and I should have started chain of command. Which I did but the problem is no one downstairs had the authority to say yes, you can continue. Do the orientation later or there will be another orientation. We can sign you up for another one. It's like these are the rules. Next one is December. And oh, by the way I was told I have to start the paperwork all over again, including the application, the vendor, everything. All the paperwork that had been submitted start all over again.</p> <p>So, for some of us having some mental issues and ups and downs, it was very, very stressful. Extremely stressful. Brought me to tears to be honest with you.</p>

My name is Dr. Mohammed, clinical psychologist, chair core petitioner and author of bureau care and BBC pipeline frameworks entered into county record on April 10, 2025, under law. I want to respectfully raise one issue regarding the public participation process.</p> <p>Most recent written comments. Earlier the deadline was one day. For many ADA protected participants including those using assistive technology, translation services, operating under medical leave, this new timeline effectively restricted access to timely participation.</p> <p>Under title two of the Americans with Disabilities Act, procedures must be remodified to ensure equal opportunity. Therefore, ask the commission to clarify when and by what authority the three day rule was adopted and confirm accommodation is available for ADA participants and authors and lastly to ensure that you are going to</p>

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				retain Exhibit 224 filed on October 15, 2025, within the official administrative records preserved, providence and also transparency. Upholds the mission of advocacy, accountability, ethics, and oversight in action ensuring public input remains accessible for all members of the community. Thank you for your time and your continued commitment to equitable participation and procedural fairness.
Public Comment	Jean Harris	By Phone	General	<p>Hi. This is Gene Harris, service area one. I want to express appreciation for Chair Manalo to come all the way up to the Antelope Valley to attend our SALT meeting. Thank you so much for making that effort. It is really appreciated and wonderful for you to be there.</p> <p>I would like to talk about the service area one representation on the commission.</p> <p>We were informed at the SALT that you, he, and an ah lease has been appointed by Supervisor Barger and that is our lack of representation for our service area in the Antelope Valley. We do not have any representation since Judy Cooperberg retired and left her position. And so, I think it's important that someone in the community is able to represent on the commission for behavioral health.</p> <p>I also reiterate the CAF stipend issue and the training issue. I have tried very hard to address the concerns of many of our community members about not receiving their stipends for months, about the onus of having to have the technology to be able to participate. I myself had an issue with membership in the SALT because they</p>

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				<p>wanted me to download the application, sign it, scan it, and e mail it back.</p> <p>And so, because of my concerns about others being able to do that, then I was able to fill out my application again at the SALT meeting because I did not have the capability to do all that and I think a lot of other people have that issue too.</p> <p>I've asked about trainings. I know there's another training coming up in December. I attended the one in July, but I don't participate in the CAF program. I just want to know what's happening so I can support our community members. We don't know when that's going to happen in December. In the July orientation, we were told that once we had five people interested in the orientation that Ms. Walker would provide one but that hasn't happened.</p> <p>Okay. I don't have a clock here. I've given people e mails but no responses. I talked to the liaison, etcetera.</p> <p>Also, the last e mail I got from the DMH subscriptions for the Behavioral Health Commission was in July and I've been getting kicked off of e mail subscriptions to get notifications for meetings. And so, I want you to be aware of that as well. Thank you.</p>

My concern in particular, now the co-chair stipend has doubled, and I had served an extra two months in the co-chair position up until our new co chair was on made her debut. I'm now concerned about missing on. I haven't had a chance yet. This is something that hit me recently and I got to thinking and brainstorming. So now that I'm here with you all, I want to express it to you all to help me in support finding out when this co-chair increase stipend is effective and that I should qualify in the two months I was still serving until the new co chair came on board. I don't think we have any and I think that's something that needs to take place. These are places that have home like residence in the community. They're supportive and (indiscernible).</p> <p>Another one was (indiscernible) off medications but they didn't have to take it. They're a small community. Have no more than 12 residents. They can have long term stays up to six months. Small community home like environment with no more than 12 residents including staff. Long term stays up to six months. Community of people.</p> <p>Okay. That's what's called superior house. Model developed by Dr. Mohser in 1971. Yeah. My thought is we need to get more of those -- get some of those going in Los Angeles County.</p>

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				<p>Commissioner: Okay. Thank you very much, Mark. Mark, are you talking about peer respite homes?</p> <p>Mark: Yes. Basically. I think that's a good idea. Thank you very much. I appreciate that. I do have another public comment. If you want to hear it. (Time ran out – Comment Ended)</p>

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Public Comment	Dr. Esroruleh Mohammed	Email	General	<p>Dear Commissioners,</p> <p>I submit this written public comment in accordance with the timeline listed in the October 23, 2025 meeting notice.</p> <p>As a clinical psychologist currently on ADA medical leave and a consistent public participant in Commission proceedings since April 2025—including the April 4 CARE Court Town Hall and the April 10 Executive Committee Hearing—I wish to respectfully raise a procedural concern regarding recent changes to the Commission’s written public comment policy.</p> <p>Earlier meeting notices (for example, April 24, 2025) permitted written comments to be received one day prior to the meeting. The October 2025 notice now requires written comments by three days in advance, with no public record of policy amendment or explanation for the change.</p> <p>While I understand the need for administrative timelines, such a modification can unintentionally restrict access for ADA-protected and multilingual participants who rely on assistive communication or who require additional time to review late-released materials. Under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, procedural policies must be reasonably modified to ensure effective participation for qualified individuals with disabilities.</p>

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				<p>Accordingly, I respectfully request that the Commission:</p> <p>Clarify whether the current three-day written-comment rule was formally adopted after April 2025, and identify the policy authority or procedural vote authorizing that change.</p> <p>Confirm that reasonable modification and accommodation procedures remain available to ADA-protected participants to ensure equal opportunity for timely public comment.</p> <p>Acknowledge and retain Exhibit Q-24, submitted on October 15, 2025, in the Commission’s administrative record for transparency and provenance continuity.</p> <p>I submit this comment in good faith and with full respect for the Commission’s mission of “Advocacy, Accountability, and Oversight in Action.” Ensuring equitable participation in the Commission’s processes is itself an essential form of accountability and public trust.</p> <p>For completeness, Exhibit Q-24 is reattached here to ensure continuity of the public record.</p> <p>Respectfully submitted, Dr. Esroruleh T.
