She's been here for three months and in the last three months her and her brother have been bounced around from place to place. She was advocating and asking for her voice as the caregiver to be acknowledged and utilized while her brother is not in a space to be able to advocate for himself.</p> <p>Kim and her brother is saying that they've been here from Texas for three months. They've been bounced around from place to place. Her brother had to be hospitalized last Thursday for not having medication and they are current consumers and also not having effective and supportive case management and she's also looking for supportive housing so her and her brother's life could stabilize. So I shared with Commissioner Austria was able to meet her while the brother was having his breakdown and so I advocate -- I said I would come and share their story as she had to take him out of here. Because the ladies, that they called the police, the school called the police on him. Yeah, nothing happened. They suspend him and is out of the school every week. Therapist don't know what to do. So I need help for my grand daughter and grandson more importantly.

These centers prioritize peer support, empowerment, and self-determined approaches to recovery, often providing activities such as support groups, wellness education, resource navigation, and social connection. They are designed to be welcoming, low-barrier spaces that affirm dignity, autonomy, and lived experience as central components of healing and recovery." CBHPC Specifically states that the State uses this data to prepare its application for the SAMHSA block grant. We do NOT want to get rid of this! This is essential in preserving peer-run programs as we transition to BHSA. Commissioners, please move forward with this. Hollywood 2.0 is not peer-run! SHARE! is the first Peer Run Organization to contract with LA County DMH, and we have two Wellness and Recovery Centers, one in SA5. We would love the opportunity to highlight our work.
