Good morning,

My name is **Cindy Breor**, and I am submitting a written public comment for the upcoming Behavioral Health Commission meeting on 11/20/25. I may attend by phone, but I would like this statement entered into the public record.

Public Comment – Cindy Breor

I am sharing this as a sister who is exhausted, heartbroken, and done being silent. For years, my family stayed quiet out of shame. The world judges what it does not understand.

My sister has struggled with mental illness since childhood. What people once dismissed as “behavioral issues” were early signs of a mind in crisis. She has spent her entire life fighting a brain that will not give her rest, and yet she is judged far more often than she is helped.

The last ten years have been a relentless cycle of hospitalizations, psychosis, missing-person reports, and crisis calls. She stabilizes just long enough to be released - often to the streets despite our pleas. This revolving door and abandonment devastates families and leaves people like my sister without any real safety or treatment.

People don't see what this does to caregivers.
They don't see how it has drained every peaceful year my mother should have had.
How a woman who survived war, the loss of her husband - now carries a grief no parent should ever face.

The painful truth is there is a complete lack of communication across our fragmented system. Every hospitalization, every crisis, every discharge happens in isolation. The burden is always on the family to piece together the history and retell the trauma.

And I say this as someone fluent in English, organized, and persistent.
If I can barely keep up, what happens to families who can't?
To immigrant families?
To people working multiple jobs?
To those without the language skills or capacity to track years of crises?

In California:

- 1 in 7 adults lives with mental illness.
- Over 1.2 million live with severe mental illness.

Despite some of the highest taxes in the nation, too many of our loved ones are still returned to the streets untreated, unprotected, and unsafe.

This treat-and-release cycle is not care.
It is abandonment with paperwork attached.

I am not asking for perfection or miracles.

I am asking for a system that fulfills the purpose it was built for -
to protect the vulnerable, not leave them to survive alone.

Thank you for taking the time to read this, and for allowing families like mine to finally be heard.

Thank you for your October 16 message regarding the timing of written public-comment submissions.

Respectfully, I wish to clarify that my submission of Exhibit Q-24 (Cross-Temporal Convergence Note) was not intended solely as same-day “public comment,” but rather as a documentary supplement to the Commission’s administrative record under its oversight of system reform and ADA compliance.

As background, I have consistently provided written materials to the Commission—including at the April 4 CARE Court Town Hall (submitted via chat due to technical audio barriers) and the April 10 Executive Commission Hearing, where the BCCP™ framework was first entered into the public record. These earlier submissions were received without timing restriction and have since informed multiple County and State equity reviews.

Given this established pattern of engagement and my current status as an **ADA-protected participant**, I respectfully request clarification on the following points:

1. **Whether the Commission’s “three-day-prior” rule applies equally to record documentation as distinct from public comment, and whether reasonable modification is available under the ADA’s effective-communication provisions** to ensure equitable participation for individuals submitting analytical materials in writing.
2. **Whether Exhibit Q-24 will be retained in the administrative record** for transparency and provenance review, consistent with the Commission’s obligations under the **Brown Act**, the **California Public Records Act**, and **Title II ADA access standards**.

This clarification is submitted in good faith for procedural accuracy and accessibility compliance. I would appreciate confirmation that Exhibit Q-24 will be **preserved for administrative continuity**, even if it is not formally docketed as a “public comment.”

Thank you for providing the October 9 meeting materials. I confirm receipt of all eleven attachments, including the Director's Update (Chief Deputy Ms. Hundal), SAPC Legislative Update (Director Dr. Tsai), and CARE Court Overview (Deputy Director Mr. Jones and Supervisor Dr. Church). I appreciate the Commission's responsiveness and commitment to transparency.

As an initial observation, none of the materials cite the **BCCP™ / B2C3A™** frameworks, fidelity safeguards, ADA/IPM disclosures, or clinical ethical standards. This is notable because the Commission was the first public venue in which I introduced these frameworks—during the April 4 CARE Court Town Hall and the April 10 Executive Commission Hearing—while serving as both an ADA-protected clinician and a CARE Court petitioner.

At that April 4 Town Hall, I raised concerns regarding oversight and inclusion within the CARE Court process—issues later reflected in the July 1 statutory amendment (SB 42), which mandates inclusion of both petitioners and respondents in evaluation processes. Yet, both my brother (as respondent) and I (as petitioner) remain excluded from any formal evaluation or engagement, contrary to the statute. This raises concern that the petitioner role—and associated analytical disclosures—may be referenced in policy or reform materials without lawful participation or ADA-compliant inclusion.

The omission of attribution to BCCP™ / B2C3A™—frameworks developed under ADA protection—across all three presentations also raises licensed clinical and professional ethics concerns (APA, AMA, NASW) regarding provenance, authorship integrity, and the responsible integration of lived expertise into public systems reform.

Accordingly, I respectfully request clarification on the following:

1. How does the Commission safeguard against the unacknowledged appropriation of ADA-protected, copyright-registered frameworks developed by displaced clinical professionals?
2. What oversight applies when ADA/IPM-originating disclosures are incorporated into County reform narratives involving public funding, reputational benefit, or policy influence?

3. What mechanisms ensure that CARE Court petitioners and respondents—particularly those ADA-protected—are lawfully included in evaluation processes as required by statute, and not referenced in materials absent consent or acknowledgment?
4. How does the Commission define its oversight role in maintaining ethical standards, community safety, and protections for ADA-protected professionals whose analytical work informs County strategy?

Understanding this oversight framework is essential to maintaining public trust and ensuring that ADA-originating and lived-experience contributions are integrated transparently, ethically, and in full compliance with statutory and civil-rights standards.

I am writing in advance of the November 13, 2025 Behavioral Health Commission meeting to respectfully follow up on my prior written submissions transmitted on October 15, 18, and 20, 2025, each of which included Exhibit Q-24 (Cross-Temporal Convergence Note, June 2024 → October 2025) and related correspondence.

To date, I have not received confirmation that these materials have been retained in the Commission’s administrative record or acknowledged under the Commission’s ADA and Brown Act obligations. Because the Commission’s November 13 agenda again includes discussion of policy updates and CARE Court directives, it is essential that the prior Exhibit Q-24 materials remain part of the active administrative record for continuity and provenance review.

For record clarity:

- The above submissions were transmitted under my confirmed ADA Title II / § 504 written-communication accommodation (CRD approval 10/23/25).
- They are governed by the **Unified BCCP™ / B2C3A™ Evidentiary Convergence Protocol**, which standardizes ADA record-continuity, attribution, and procedural linkage across County and State entities.
- These filings therefore fall within Title II effective-communication and record-retention requirements (28 C.F.R. § 35.160; Gov. Code § 11135).

Accordingly, I respectfully request written confirmation that:

1. **Exhibit Q-24** and the associated October 2025 correspondence have been preserved in the Commission’s official administrative and public-record archives; and
2. The Commission’s “three-day-prior” written-comment policy does not restrict ADA-protected written submissions intended for administrative-record inclusion rather than general public comment.

For clarity, please treat this correspondence as both an ADA Title II procedural notice and a written public comment for inclusion in the official record of Commission proceedings, consistent with Government Code § 11120 et seq. and the Commission’s public-comment policy.

This clarification is submitted in good faith to ensure procedural accuracy, accessibility compliance, and record continuity for the upcoming meeting.

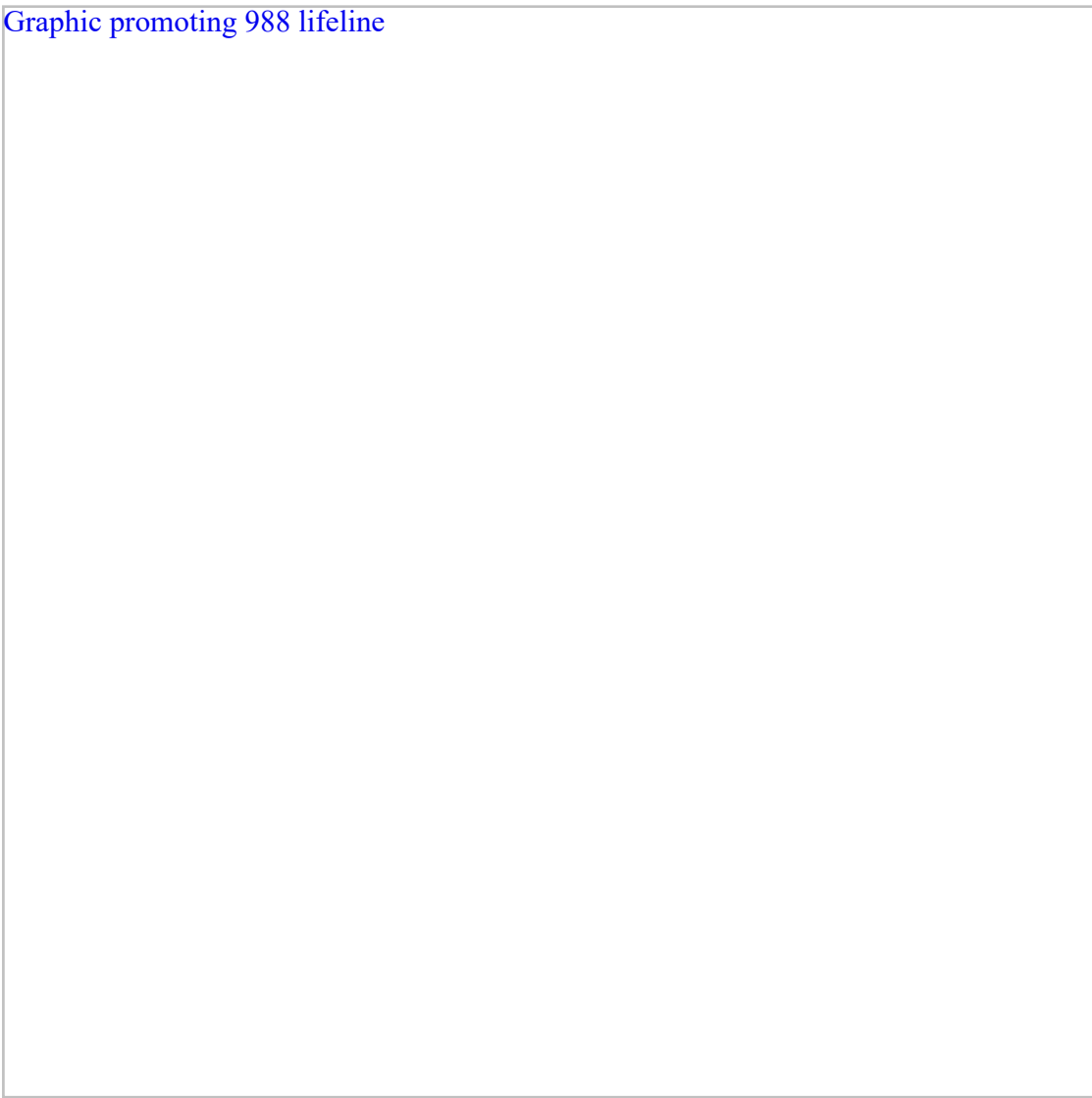
